# Mixed Methods Promoting Wellness and Recovery (MPWR) Lab

PI: Colin MaHoney, Ph.D.

Grad Student: Reagan Fitzke

**RAs:** Looking for at least 7 RAs for soon-to-be-launched pilot studies **Research Focus:** Co-occurring PTSD and SUD following exposure to interpersonal violence (e.g., sexual assault, intimate partner violence [IPV], community violence) among women, and military trauma among veterans of all gender identities.

Recent work: Clinical PhD student Reagan Fitzke just received a F3 I Notice of Award (NoA) from NIAAA to develop a protective behavioral strategies scale for normative alcohol and cannabis co-use among women sexual assault survivors to mitigate risk of revictimization!

Dr. Mahoney recently published a study on trajectories of PTSD symptoms and functional impairment among men and women veterans in the Journal of Psychopathology and Clinical Science with colleagues at the National Center for PTSD. Recently submitted a manuscript to a peer-reviewed journal for publication focused on cross-lagged associations between perceived social support and alcohol misuse (while controlling for PTSD symptoms) among women IPV survivors. We are also preparing an R01 application for NIDA examining co-occurring cannabis use and PTSD among veterans, and launching 4 pilot studies that examine and treat PTSD+SUD among a variety of populations, including marginalized women and sexual and gender minority folx. All of our work is intended to inform, enhance, and develop integrated assessment measures and interventions for PTSD+SUD among underserved populations.

Research Focus: Neurobiology of PTSD and Alcohol Use Disorders

**Current work:** Current ongoing studies in the Ornelas lab utilize predator odor stress models to induce traumatic stress in rats and examine alcohol drinking after stressor exposure. Specifically, the lab will be investigating the role of the endocannabinoid system in regulating maladaptive stress

coping behaviors and alcohol drinking.

Logan Hall is now home to 12 brand new Med Associate alcohol self-administration chambers to examine alcohol consumption in rodents (big thanks to Carlos Maestras-Olguin for helping Dr. Ornelas install the chambers this summer!) 




